HOW TO EXHIBIT

(Sections 11 to 23 inclusive)

1. Complete the entry form (in back of schedule) and post with entry fee to Beenleigh Show Society, Post Office Box 66, Beenleigh, Qld 4207. All completed forms must be received by 5 pm on FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 8th 2017. Additional entry forms are available from the Secretary or may be photocopied.
2. Exhibits will be received by the Stewards from 7.30 a.m. to 12 noon on FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 15th 2017. Please take exhibits to the Pavilion. Tickets must be attached by sellotape or pin to the articles before handing to the Stewards.
3. Exhibits will be judged from 1.00 pm FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 15th, 2017.
4. Exhibits must be collected on SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 17th, 2017 between 10 am and 11 am. No exhibits may be removed before 10 am. Stewards are not responsible for exhibits after 11 am on Sunday September 17th, 2017.
5. **PRIZES.** First \$10.00 - Second \$5.00 unless otherwise stated.
Where a trophy is allocated, there is no cash First Prize.
6. **ENTRY FEES:** \$2.00 unless otherwise stated.
7. An Exhibitor whose Entry Fees are \$50 or over will receive a **FREE PASS** to the 2017 Annual Show.
8. Late Entries will only be accepted in Section 13 (Cut Flowers)
9. Points for Sections 11 to 23 inclusive will be : first - three points : second - one point. In the event of a tie for Most Successful Exhibitor, the Trophy will be awarded to the person awarded the most First prizes.
10. To collect exhibits, Entry Docket must be presented to the Stewards. No one is to remove their exhibits from the display, as this is the responsibility of the Stewards.
11. Prize money and trophies may be collected between 10 am and 11 am on Sunday from the Secretary's Office.

RULES FOR RICH DARK FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION. (Class 12)

- ♥ Own recipe maybe used.
- ♥ To be one-pound (500g) mixture with approx. 2.25kg of fruit to be used, including currants (whole), sultanas and raisins (cut), mixed peel (cherries and nuts optional)
- ♥ To be baked in a 27cm (10 inch) SQUARE tin.
- ♥ *The winner at the BEENLEIGH SHOW will be eligible to enter in the Sub-chamber final to be held at Beenleigh in July next year. The winner of the Sub-chamber final will be required to enter at the Royal Queensland Show in Brisbane in August next year.*
